

RESOLUTION TO EXCEED THE COUNTY TAX LEVY LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK AS PER N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a county shall limit any increase in its county tax levy to **2.5%** unless authorized by resolution to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's county tax levy, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a county may, when authorized by resolution, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual county tax levy and the 3.5% percentage rate, subject to certain exceptions, as an exception to its final county tax levies in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Warren finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2022 budget by up to 3.5%, subject to certain exceptions, over the previous year's final county tax levy, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners hereby determines that a one percent increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$ 578,867 in excess of the increase in final county tax levy otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners hereby determines that any amount authorized herein above that is not levied, as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final county tax levy in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Warren, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2022 budget year, the budget of the County of Warren shall, in accordance with this resolution and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 1%, amounting to \$ 578,867, and that the CY 2022 county budget for the County of Warren be approved and adopted in accordance with this resolution; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not levied as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to the final county tax levy in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this resolution as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this resolution upon adoption, with the recorded vote included there on be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

RESOLUTION ADOPTING TAX LEVY CAP TO BE APPLIED TO THE 2022 COUNTY BUDGET

WHEREAS, the County introduced its 2022 County Budget on February 23, 2022, which is scheduled for adoption by the Warren County Board of County Commissioners on March 23, 2022, and

WHEREAS, the County's Budget has to be reviewed and approved by the Division of Local Government Services within the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Division has reviewed the County's Budget, has determined that the 1977 and 2010 maximum allowable amount to be raised by taxation is the same and is requiring that the County signify adoption of a tax levy cap by Resolution of its Board of County Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, a careful review of the New Jersey Local Budget Law which governs the formulation, approval and adoption of a County Budget, specifically N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.45a(1) requires that the amount to be raised by taxation in the case of a County shall not exceed the amounts permitted under the 1977 Tax Levy Cap Law; and

WHEREAS, based upon a review of the Local Budget Law provisions, the County Counsel and County Chief Financial Officer believe that the law requires the County to adhere to the tax cap levy provisions established pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.4 and 40A:4-45.45;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Warren County Board of County Commissioners that the County does hereby adopt the 1977 tax levy cap provisions provided for in the aforementioned statutes and that said provisions shall govern the enactment and enforcement of Warren County's 2022 Budget.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY OF WARREN TO EXCEED THE WARREN COUNTY PROSECUTOR'S OFFICE BUDGET REQUEST CAP (P.L. 2015, c.249) FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2022

- WHEREAS, P.L. 2015, c. 249 requires a county entity to submit a budget request to the county governing body that is comprised of two parts; the amount to be raised by property taxation, and the amount to be funded wholly through Federal or State funds, fees raised by the county entity, or other sources; and
- WHEREAS, the term "county entity" means a county board of taxation, office of the county superintendent of election, office to the county board of election, office of the county register of deeds and mortgages, office of the county clerk, office of the county surrogate, office of the county prosecutor, and county sheriff's department; and
- **WHEREAS**, P.L. 2015, c. 249 limits the increase in the portion of a county entity budget request funded by property taxation to no more than two percent (2%) of the previous year's budget request, subject to certain limited exceptions; and
- **WHEREAS**, the portion of the budget request submitted by the Warren County Prosecutor's Office that is funded by property taxation does not exceed the cap imposed by P.L. 2015, c. 249; and
- **WHEREAS**, over the last three years, the Warren County Prosecutor's Office Cyber Crimes Unit has seen an alarming growth in cyber tips from the National Center for missing and exploited children along with a work load increase of sixty (60) percent since the inception of the unit in 2015; and
- WHEREAS, additional personnel will enhance both a proactive and reactive response in conducting investigations into the endangerment of children, which arrive in the form of child pornography or the luring of children; and

RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE OFFICE OF MANAGEMENT AND BUDGET TO CLASSIFY THE COUNTY OF WARREN, NEW JERSEY IN THE NEW YORK-NEWARK-JERSEY CITY, NY-NJ-PA METROPOLITAN STATISTICAL AREA

WHEREAS, currently, the U.S. Census Bureau classifies Warren County in the Allentown Urban Area and the Office of Management and Budget classifies Warren County within the Allentown-Bethlehem Easton, PA Metropolitan Statistical Area (ABE MSA); and

WHEREAS, Warren County's classification within the Allentown Urban Area and the ABE MSA will be reevaluated according to the proposed standards for defining Urban Areas and Core Based Statistical Areas and using the data from the 2020 Decennial Census and the American Community Survey; and

WHEREAS, a Core Based Statistical Area (CBSA) is a "geographical statistical entity consisting of a county or counties associated with at least core (Urban Area) of at least 10,000 population, plus adjacent counties having a high degree of social and economic integration with the core as measured through commuting ties with the counties containing the core. Metropolitan and micropolitan statistical areas are the two categories of core based statistical areas"; and

WHEREAS, a Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) is "a core based statistical area associated with at least Urban Area that has a population of at least 50,000. The MSA comprises the central county or counties containing the core, plus adjacent outlying counties having a high degree of social and economic integration with the central county or counties as measured through commuting"; and

WHEREAS, the 2020 Standards for Delineating Core Based Statistical Areas (the Standards) state that "A Core Based Statistical Area (CBSA) is a geographical entity associated with at one core of 10,000 or population, plus adjacent territory that has a high degree of social and economic integration with the core as measured by commuting ties"; and

WHEREAS, the 2020 Standards state that "Commuting and employment estimates are derived from the Census Bureau's American Community Survey"; and

WHEREAS, according to the Standards "a county qualifies as an outlying county of a CBSA if it meets the following commuting requirements: a) At least 25 percent of the workers living in the county work in the central county or counties of the CBSA; or b) At least 25 percent of the employment in the county is accounted for by workers who reside in the central county or counties of the CBSA; and

WHEREAS, according to the 2015-2019 American Community Survey (the most recent available), 49.39% of Warren County's workforce commuted to employment locations within the New York-Newark MSA while only 4.33% of Warren County's workforce commuted to locations within the ABE MSA; and

WHEREAS, according to the most recent American Community Survey, 17.5% of the jobs in Warren County were held from commuters from the counties within the New York – Newark MSA, and 17.5% of the jobs in Warren County were held from commuters from counties with the ABE MSA; and

WHEREAS, based on the above survey data there is a much stronger commuting tie to the counties located within the New York-Newark MSA than to the ABE MSA; and

WHEREAS, Warren County is a member of the North Jersey Transportation Planning Authority (NJTPA), the region's Metropolitan Planning Organization that is comprised voting membership of the 13 northern NJ Counties and two cities, Jersey City and Newark, to plan for and award federal funds for needed transportation projects and programs in the region; and

WHEREAS, twelve of the thirteen counties that are members of the NJTPA are classified within the New York-Newark MSA with the exception of Warren County; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the commuting data, Warren County's socio-economic characteristics and New Jersey's taxation and regulatory policies, support reclassifying Warren County into the New York-Newark MSA rather than continuing with the ABE MSA; and

WHEREAS, the data supports the fact that Warren County is more closely affiliated with the New York-Newark MSA than with the ABE MSA; and

WHEREAS, based on the above data and affiliations, it is justified to classify Warren County within the New York-Newark MSA, along with the adjacent counties of Sussex, Morris, and Hunterdon Counties and the other counties within the NJTPA region.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXECUTIVE SESSION OF THE WARREN COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS PROVIDING FOR A MEETING NOT OPEN TO THE PUBLIC IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE NEW JERSEY OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12

WHEREAS, the Warren County Board of County Commissioners is subject to certain requirements of the *Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A.* 10:4-6, et seq., and

WHEREAS, the *Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A.* 10:4-12, provides that an Executive Session, not open to the public, may be held for certain specified purposes when authorized by Resolution, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that this Board hereby excludes the public in order to discuss such matters. The general nature of the subjects to be discussed are as follows:

- (1) *Matters Required by Law to be Confidential:* Any matter which, by express provision of Federal law or State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act.
- (2) Matters Where the Release of Information Would Impair the Right to Receive Funds: Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the Government of the United States.
- (3) Matters Involving Individual Privacy: Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned (or, in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly.
- (4) Matters Relating to Collective Bargaining Agreements: Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof with employees or representatives of employees of the public body.
- (5) Matters Relating to the Purchase, Lease or Acquisition of Real Property or the Investment of Public Funds:

Any matter involving the purchase, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds, where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed.

- (6) Matters Relating to Public Safety and Property: Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of possible violations of the law.
- (7) Matters Relating to Litigation, Negotiations and the Attorney-Client Privilege: Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is, or many become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is required in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer.
- (8) Matters Relating to the Employment Relationship: Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance or promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all the individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting.
- (9) Matters Relating to the Potential Imposition of a Penalty: Any deliberations of a public body occurring after a public hearing that may result in the imposition of a specific civil penalty upon the responding party or the suspension or loss of a license or permit belonging to the responding party bearing responsibility.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board shall disclose to the public, as soon as practicable, the contents of the discussions after the final disposition of the matters discussed.
