# RESOLUTION IN OPPOSITION OF NEW JERSEY DIVISION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL'S SPECIAL CONDITIONS ON LIMITED BREWERY LICENSEES

**WHEREAS**, the New Jersey Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control (NJABC) issued new special conditions on each limited brewery licensee in the state beginning Friday, July 1, 2022; and

WHEREAS, under the license conditions, craft breweries are limited to hold 25 on-site activities open to the general public annually, as well as 52 private parties. Breweries can also attend 12 off-premises events, such as town, charitable and holiday celebrations; and

WHEREAS, under these license conditions, craft breweries have restrictions on the types of television programing they can air in their tasting rooms, restricts what types of live or record music they can play or host, limits what food options they can make available to customers, bans the sale of coffee, and prohibits the sale of soft drinks and other non-alcoholic beverages not made onsite at the brewery; and

**WHEREAS,** according to the national Brewers Association, the one-hundred and forty-one craft breweries operating in New Jersey in calendar year 2021 contributed almost \$2 billion to the state's economy, creating over 11,000 jobs at an annually income of more than \$55,000 per employee; and

**WHEREAS**, Warren County is home to four microbreweries: Czig Meister Brewing Company and Man Skirt Brewing in Hackettstown, Buttzville Brewing Company in Washington Borough and Invertase Brewing Company in Phillipsburg; and

**WHEREAS**, this past spring, these breweries created the "Skylands Ale Trail," which has brought thousands of visitors to Warren County to experience these breweries and visit other neighboring local businesses; and

WHEREAS, these new conditions will force these local, homegrown small businesses to rethink business models and closely consider which events they should participate in or host, which will reduce their profits and their opportunities to engage in their communities; and

WHEREAS, visiting these microbreweries is about each of their unique experiences, and these proprietors have found exciting ways to engage other local businesses, vendors and artists in their communities; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Warren strongly opposes the New Jersey Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control's Special Conditions on Limited Brewery Licensees; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that copies of this resolution shall be forwarded to each municipality in Warren County, all the counties of New Jersey, the leaders of the New Jersey Legislature and Governor Phil Murphy.

Commissioner Kern wanted to read this into the record, "This ruling actually began in 2019 and the state held off on it after significant push back for the Brewery community because of what it would to their business model. Then was suspended again because of COVID, because they did not want to impact these businesses during a pandemic and then, to a surprise to many breweries, after talking to them, this went into effect the July 4th weekend. Now it's causing great concern in the micro-brewery community. As you know, the four listed in Warren County are incredible successful, each of them works so well with their local communities. There seems to be this false narrative of an adversarial relationship between the breweries and the restaurants, which in Warren County couldn't be any further from the truth because the breweries work with the restaurants, they deliver the food there, serve the beer in the restaurants themselves. This is truly a text book definition of bad government of just awful regulation. I don't know who is behind it or what the reasoning is behind it, but I hope that the legislature and the governor act to rescind this immediately. The governor can do it with executive order, legislature could pass a bill, which it sounds like there is something being worked on." Commissioner Kern has been in touch with the breweries in Warren County, the local elected officials in each of these communities, and especially want to thank Eric Orlando of the Brewers Guild of New Jersey who helped craft this resolution, which will be the first county in the state to pass it. It is really important, we want to support small businesses. The governor and administration are out there doing and "Take a Shot and Get a Beer" during COVID that would be considered an event by this standard, this is absolute lunacy. Commissioner Kern, thanked Director Sarnoski for having this item on the agenda.

Director Sarnoski, Governor Murphy's administration pushed hard on the brewers to push his COVID shot agenda, with the shot and beer campaign, now he seems to punish them. It is really sad, they stepped up to plate for his administration back then, to help with the COVID shot, now he can't step up to the plate for them. He hurt small business in Warren County and all around the state to maybe help large brewers and large restaurant owners. I am happy to have this on the agenda tonight.

Commissioner Ciesla understands who he is actually helping, Warren County is a small county we only have about 100,000 people. Years ago when they changed the laws, they put into effect, you could only have one liquor license per 3,000 people. We don't get a lot of people out here, so our breweries actually work with our restaurants because we are not overloaded with them. However, a few years ago in Short Hills, because of these antiquated rules, a chain restaurant paid \$2.3 million dollars for a liquor license in Short Hills because these are the hottest items. Part of the problem is the dollar amount that is being paid for liquor licenses. The average cost in the State of New Jersey is \$350,000.00 to hold a Class C license, which is what the restaurants obtain. New York restaurants do not come into New Jersey, because it is ridiculous, they cannot get the license, there is barely any licenses to get. Class A license is what the breweries get, cost is approximately \$10,000.00, and this is where they are getting upset. The four breweries in Warren County are part of the community and they are helping the restaurants. Glad we are the first to do this resolution, hoping for bipartisan support around this state, these rules are antiquated and ridiculously big. The municipal handbook for municipal clerks to deal with this kind of liquor license is eighty-four pages, one hundred and eleven sections in the N.J.S.A. law that govern liquor license. Along with thirty-three sections of the New Jersey Administrative Code. It is ridiculous even if you wanted to have a beer tent at your community day event. Hope this gets the ball rolling so we can get some changes made in this state so we can finally compete.

### REPORTS AND COMMENTS

County Counsel Joe Bell had no official report this evening.

County Engineer Bill Gleba reported NJ DOT did return back to Knowlton Township to look into the interchange. Our traffic engineer met with DOT on-site, they are looking into signage updates and some different types of channelization. We will see what they come up with. Director Sarnoski commented, unless they change that roadway and narrow it, or do something to divert the trucks, it's very difficult to stop the trucks from going that way. Mr. Gleba reported part of the problem is there is no signage, so the trucks are going across the bridge. DOT is trying to come up with a system to address the situation. As we asked they are looking into the situation.

County Planner Dave Dech discussed the Warren Scenic Byway meeting held on Monday, July 11, 2022. Draft nominations of the applications were prepared for the northern and southern extensions, the scenic byway committee concurred with the write ups. Nominations will be sent to NJDOT, Scenic Byway Coordinator, hopefully the application will be approved for the extension of the scenic byway out to Waterloo Village and to Union Square in Phillipsburg.

County Public Works Director Emily Hammer was not in attendance.

County CFO Kim Francisco did not have anything more to report tonight.

County Administrator Alex Lazorisak discussed the current vacancy report, nothing out of the ordinary. Few backfill of positions, we are having difficulties trying to fill positions. Also, reminded County Commissioner meeting for July 27, 2022 has been cancelled, the next regular scheduled meeting will be August 10, 2022.

### **COMMISSIONER COMMENTS**

Commissioner Kern had been talking with County CFO and County Administrator, regarding the opioid settlement. We should be identifying what agency or groups that money should go to. County Administrator Lazorisak is looking at the conditions of the settlement as to who the money should be administered by, along with how the monies can be spent per the settlement documents. Thank you New Jersey Association of Counties (NJAC) for their assistance. Warren County is getting one percent, which equals approximately \$104,000.00, equivalent to \$1.00 per resident.

Commissioner Ciesla, thanked Commissioner Kern, for what he has done for the breweries.

Commissioner Ciesla reported municipal voices have been finally heard regarding receiving some of the utility money. I think we may get a little extra money for the energy receipts, NJ League of Municipalities has been working on. Commissioner Ciesla has spoken with John Donnadio at NJAC to ask what additional monies would be received. This will help the municipalities, they have been missing this money for quite a long time.

In the southern end of the county, Comcast has been visiting the towns with an interest in laying new lines as an additional company to the one that is currently servicing that area. This could create competition, which could help with pricing along with provide better speed.

Commissioner Ciesla and Public Works Director Emily Hammer will follow the updates regarding the monies for broadband services, along with compile data on the cellular service from the municipalities in the county. More information will be forth coming.

Regarding the Health and Wellness grant monies, there is monies left over that need to be used. Another mini Health and Wellness Field Day will be held at the Firth Youth Center.

Commissioner Director Sarnoski participated in the Terry Lee Memorial Run over the past weekend. Thank you to Diane Malanga with Rolling Thunder NJ Chapter 3. It was a great day, great event, had very good weather for it, and well attended. Also, thank everyone who participated and also the Sheriff's Office for all that they did and everyone else.

### **CLOSING PUBLIC COMMENTS**

Diane Malanga, President of Rolling Thunder NJ 3, came before the Board to request a parking spot for Purple Heart recipients at the courthouse near the War Memorial. Ms. Malanga presented the Board with a parking sign. When additional signs are available would like them placed around the county as well. Rolling Thunder is willing to participate with other veteran organizations to hold a small ceremony to honor our Purple Heart recipients. Commissioner Director Sarnoski asked County Administrator along with Public Works Director to look into getting the sign erected.

Ms. Malanga also presented the Board with print #915, along with the meaning, "Valley of Tears", a thousand lithographs and have been numbered. She tried to get a print number close to one of our county route numbers, was unable to get 519 so she settled for 915, which is 519 backwards. The picture along with the meaning was presented to the Board, and asked that it be hung somewhere in the county. Diane will make an appointment with the Sheriff and present his office with a copy as well.

Diane Malanga, as a citizen, would like to discuss a private matter with the Board. County Administrator Alex Lazorisak recommended reaching out the Commissioner Director Sarnoski to schedule a meeting to discuss the matter.

Ms. Malanga, had one more topic for the Board, regarding the foreclosure industry, a lot of houses are going to become vacant, after the moratorium. Ms. Malanga is a foreclosure specialist, houses are going to become abandoned again. People have not paid their mortgages in over two years, mortgage companies are livid and they want people out, want to see their houses, sometimes in different areas, undesirable areas, they become distressed and become an eye sore. When I lived in Belvidere, I worked with Belvidere to make money off of registering a vacant house. The county could also do this, it forces them to maintain the buildings, grass, roofs, and it is called property preservation. There are some really bad eye sores. The number of homes from the northern end to the southern end is staggering. As a county we should make the mortgage companies responsible. Ms. Malanga was advised this is a municipal issue, municipalities have the ordinance to enforce this issue. Commissioner Director Sarnoski will discuss this in more detail with Ms. Malanga in further detail. Ms. Malanga, thanked the Board for allowing the use of County property.

Theresa Chapman, Harmony, asked about the abandoned buildings. For example the grass area going to Target and Lowes, weeds are six feet tall, and the Phillipsburg Mall. The municipalities have the authority to enforce property maintenance. Maybe the Commissioners could reach out to the municipalities to have the ordinance enforced this is a reflection on the county as a whole. Ms. Chapman had been advised this is a municipal issue.

Tara Mezzanotte – I80 DWG Coalition – Presented an update, Monday evening Knowlton Township Mayor Adele Starrs had announced at the committee meeting that she had reached out to the NJ DOT for and update on when the updated visual impact assessment would be released, as well as the archeological studies that we do know where done, meaning the field work was done, so when is the report coming out. She was told that will happen before the end of the year. In addition, the environmental assessment will be released in the spring. That lost us six to nine months, so it really

kind of changed the game. Instead of everything happening the end of 2023, now they are talking about this happening in the spring. When the environmental assessment is released we literally have thirty days to comment whether or not we agree with the points that are put forward regarding impacts. The Commissioner Board has asked for meetings with NJ DOT, in preparation of this type of thing. We are about a year and a half out from those kinds of meetings. The technical studies that will be released will be something like a traffic study. In order for anyone to have an opinion, you will have thirty days to review it and have an opinion. So the question will be, is it possible for other cooperating agencies, get to see these technical studies before release. Since we are not a cooperating agency, we do not have the ability to ask for such a thing. How would the county feel about sending a letter asking for the technical study on the traffic study before the release of the environmental impact assessment? Commissioner Director Sarnoski would like to talk with County Planning Director Dave Dech to see where we are at with any response to a meeting. County Planner has not gotten anything back regarding our continuous requests. Commissioner Director stated we can ask again and can ask that we be included with any environmental assessment and environmental study that way we have to time to review and comment. Mezzanotte thinks that would be prudent. Commissioner Director requested advance notice to allow Ms. Mezzanotte additional time to present at an upcoming meeting. Will be able to allow fifteen minutes at an upcoming meeting to give an update on the Rock fall Mitigation and S-Curve projects. Ms. Mezzanotte requested to be put on the agenda for August 10, 2022.

Stuart Ridley, Phillipsburg, asked Commissioner Sarnoski when the Parental Bill of Rights Forum will be taking place. Commissioner Director Sarnoski is working on scheduling it, have been very busy with working on other items going on within the county. Working to get something before the end of the summer, so there is something to release before the end of summer.

**WHEREAS**, the New Jersey Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control (NJABC) issued new special conditions on each limited brewery licensee in the state beginning Friday, July 1, 2022; and

- **WHEREAS**, under the license conditions, craft breweries are limited to hold 25 on-site activities open to the general public annually, as well as 52 private parties. Breweries can also attend 12 off-premises events, such as town, charitable and holiday celebrations; and
- WHEREAS, under these license conditions, craft breweries have restrictions on the types of television programing they can air in their tasting rooms, restricts what types of live or record music they can play or host, limits what food options they can make available to customers, bans the sale of coffee, and prohibits the sale of soft drinks and other non-alcoholic beverages not made onsite at the brewery; and
- WHEREAS, according to the national Brewers Association, the one-hundred and forty-one craft breweries operating in New Jersey in calendar year 2021 contributed almost \$2 billion to the state's economy, creating over 11,000 jobs at an annually income of more than \$55,000 per employee; and
