This is important to identify the struggles that are being experience. He thanked the Mental Health Board for all that they do.

County Counsel_had nothing to report.

County Engineer Bill Gleba had one item to discuss, County Route 659, Spring Valley Road, Hardwick Township. Mr. Dech has provided comments to North Jersey Transportation Planning Authority (NJTPA) and New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJ DOT) and requested answers as to why.

Discussions had taken place at this time regarding the delay in the projects and costs associated with the projects. Along with the ongoing discussing with the Warren County representative at NJ DOT.

County Public Works Director provided an update regarding Breadlock Park painting and recladding of the building. Also, discussed the existing museum building being converted to an environmental center to be used as an educational and recreational center.

County CFO Kim Francisco had nothing to report.

County Administrator Alex Lazorisak had only the latest personnel vacancy report, which contained nothing out of the ordinary. Vacant positions are slowly starting to be filed.

COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

Mr. Sarnoski did not have any further comments besides the transportation items that were discussed earlier in the meeting. He spoke of the New Jersey Association of Counties (NJAC) conference, it was a great conference networked and discussed county business, Mr. Sarnoski will allow Mr. Kern to further comment on the conference.

Mr. Kern stated NJAC, great conference, county staff networking with potential vendors and had productive conversation with colleagues across the state.

Mr. Kern provided an update regarding Merrill Creek. There have been productive conversations with the local municipality, Mayor Tipton and Senator Steinhardt. We are moving forward.

Mr. Kern is asking the Boards permission to have conversation with the Highland Council regarding the quasi guidelines/regulations. He would like to have himself and county staff speak with the Highlands Council to get more information.

Ms. Ciesla provided an update regarding the Bi-centennial Cultural & Heritage Advisory Board meet and greet that was held. Looking forward to the upcoming events throughout the year.

Ms. Ciesla reminded everyone of the upcoming Health and Wellness Event, to be held on May 19, 2023 at Hackettstown High School all are invited to attend.

Broadband and cellular projects are picking up at and continuing at this time.

Warren County Community College graduation commencement will be held on Saturday, May $20^{\text{th.}}$

Lastly, Ms. Ciesla would like to defuse the rumor the county is releasing bobcats.

CLOSING PUBLIC COMMENTS

Butch VanSetters, Harmony Township came before the Board to discuss the truck traffic incidents on County Route 519, Harmony Township. There has been a couple of accidents that have taken place. Discussion took place with the Board at this time. The Commissioners will put it a call to the New Jersey State Police and request patrol of this area.

Robert Boyle, CEO of Planet Networks of Newtown, New Jersey appeared in front of the Board to provide an update regarding providing fiber optic service in Warren County. Service have begun to be provided to Knowlton, Hardwick and Frelinghuysen Township and will continue. In the future services are to be provided to the Town of Belvidere along with other municipalities. Planet Networks has applied to USDA for a grant to provide services to other parts of the county as well.

Mr. Sarnoski commented this is the way to get things done, with a private entity and not at the expense of county tax payers.

Mr. Kern asked if this Board can do anything to assist with the grant application such as a resolution. Mr. Boyle suggested to submitting a resolution of support to the federal government.

Mr. Boyle commented if services are signed on by customers, this will allow for the providing of services easier. Mr. Boyle is willing to work with Warren County with the broadband data services.

Amy Overman, JCP&L, External Affairs representing Hunterdon and Warren Counties, came before the Board to discuss the power outages happening on Brass Castle Road. Tree trimming and removal will be taking place. This has been classified as a forestry management area, this will decrease the service outages to the residents.

Liza Thomas, Liberty Township, came before the Board to make them aware of the Squatting legislation in abandoned houses, S3613 & A5243, being introduced. Her concern is in regards to the potential influx within our state.

Ms. Thomas also request road clean-up on County Route #679, Mountain Lake Road and County Route #617. Corrections Officer Buss will get these road on the list to be taken care of.



- WHEREAS, the Wall Street Journal has reported that foreign persons and entities already own billions of dollars in land in the United States, with the value of agricultural land alone approaching nearly one hundred billion dollars; and
- WHEREAS, the United States Department of Agriculture reports that at the end of 2020, foreign investors held an interest in more than forty million (40,000,000) acres of United States agricultural land; and
- **WHEREAS**, it is estimated that over 100,000 acres of land and real property within the State of New Jersey is owned by foreign persons and entities; and
- WHEREAS, the rate of such investment and ownership has steadily increased over the last decade and is projected to continue to grow substantially over next few decades; and
- WHEREAS, foreign investments in land and real property located in the County and within the State may provide undue leverage over the local supply chains and deprive residents of the community with vital resources and opportunities for land ownership and economic opportunity; and
- WHEREAS, approximately fourteen (14) states have restrictions in place regarding the amount of private agricultural land that foreign interests may own, but the Federal and State governments have yet to enact any restrictions on foreign ownership of real estate; and
- WHEREAS, foreign investors now account for almost one-third of institutional investment in single-family rental homes in the United States, which increases the price of real estate and makes it more difficult for average citizens to purchase a home; and
- **WHEREAS**, certain studies have determined that forty-seven percent (47) percent of rural renters pay a third or more of their income in rent each month; and
- WHEREAS, the State Legislature and the Governor's Office have failed to act on a bill that was introduced to curtail foreign ownership within the State; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners finds and determines that it is in the best interests of the taxpayers and residents of the County of Warren to maximize the opportunity for land ownership and economic investment for those that live, reside, work, do or patronize local business, attend school, pay taxes, raise families, volunteer, recreate and/or that otherwise choose to commit, devote or invest their personal time or finances to the overall maintenance and betterment of the Warren County Community;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners, County of Warren that, except and unless otherwise directly or indirectly provided or prohibited by any Federal or State statute, regulation or judicial precedent, no foreign government shall be qualified or eligible to purchase or acquire any legal, beneficial or other ownership interest in any County owned land or real property by sale from the County of Warren, nor shall any such foreign government be qualified or eligible for the receipt of any grants, funding or other financial or economic benefits or incentives funded through the County budget or taxes.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that nothing in this Resolution shall be construed to apply, regulate or prohibit any activity that is exempt from, or not subject to, County regulation pursuant to any federal or state law. If any provision of this Resolution is inconsistent with the statutes and/or regulations of the United States or State of New Jersey, the federal or State statutes and/or regulations shall prevail. Nothing in this Resolution shall be construed to supersede any applicable State laws.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that nothing in this Resolution shall be construed, nor is intended, to, directly or indirectly, apply to or discriminate against any particular foreign government and is specifically intended to equally, and without distinction, in the declaration of all foreign governments as ineligible and qualified.

WHEREAS, an SOE is a cultural or social event, including a wedding, held on preserved farmland, but, for the purposes of P.L. 2023, c.9., SOEs do not include the following: activities eligible for Right to Farm Act protection; recreational uses already permitted under the farmland preservation deed of easement; and weddings held for the owner, operator, or employee of the commercial farm or weddings held for certain family members of the commercial farm owner; and

- **WHEREAS**, the preserved farmland must produce agricultural or horticultural products worth \$10,000 or more annually to qualify to hold SOEs; and
- WHEREAS, Farm owners, or farm operators with written authorization from the owner, can submit an SOE application to the holder (grantee) of the Farmland Preservation Program (FPP) deed of easement; and
- **WHEREAS**, the grantee must review the application and confirm that the farm complies with its FPP deed of easement in order for it to be eligible to hold SOEs; and
- **WHEREAS**, the grantee has 90 days in which to review the application and shall approve the application if it adheres to the requirements in the law and to forthcoming regulations promulgated by the SADC; and
- WHEREAS, once an applicant receives approval to hold SOEs, the applicant is required to report annually to the grantee information about the SOEs held in the prior calendar year, including information on the dates, type of SOEs, and number of attendees of each event held; the grantee is required to send a copy of this information to the SADC; and
- **WHEREAS**, Counties are responsible for accepting, reviewing, and acting on SOE applications from farms for which they hold the FPP deed of easement; no additional approval by the SADC is required; and
